MAP REF 4 **Alderney Visitor & Wildlife Information Centre**

Pop into the information centre in Victoria Street where a team of volunteers will be able to provide you with up-to-date information, advice and a selection of free literature, walking guides and bird lists. Tel 01481 823737.

MAP REF 4 **St. Anne's Church**

Known as the Cathedral of the Channel Islands, with beautiful stained glass windows. Built in 1850.

MAP REF 4 **Alderney Museum**

This interesting museum displays a record of Alderney's fascinating history including exhibits of materials from the German Occupation, the islanders' mass evacuation in 1940 and return in 1945, the building of the harbour and breakwater, an Elizabethan wreck, an early Iron Age pottery and the Gallo-Roman occupation. MAP REF 13 **Mannez Lighthouse**

Open for guided tours Easter Saturday and Sunday and May Bank Holiday weekends at 15.00. Weekends in June at 15.00; July and August at 14.30 and 15.30; September at 15.00. Adults £3; Children (under 16) £2.

MAP REF 13/14 **Longis Nature Reserve and Birdhide**

Ideal place to watch and enjoy Alderney's rich wildlife in a fantastically positioned, peaceful environment. Tel 01481 822935.

MAP REF 15 **Val du Saou Nature Reserve and Countryside Centre**

This 7 hectare reserve is an ideal place to watch and enjoy Alderney's rich wildlife and is also home to the Countryside Centre, which is housed inside a German bunker and contains information on the island's natural and military history. Open 7 days a week. Tel 01481 822935.

MAP REF 1 **Alderney Train**

MAP REF 11 **Ramsar and Gannet Colonies**

The designated Ramsar site extends to 1,500 hectares, some 600 hectares more than mainland Alderney and includes all the waters from the island's west coast out to the northern gannet colony of Ortac, Burhou, the islets and reefs that surround it and includes Les Etacs. The site contains a mixture of habitats ranging from coastal grassland, shingle shorelines, rocky intertidal to sub-tidal kelp forests. For more information contact the Alderney Wildlife Trust. MAP REF 9/14 **The Nunnery Roman Fort**

Alderney has the best-preserved small Roman fort in Britain. Its walls once stood almost 7 metres high and visitors can see where the old Roman battlements were blocked up in the Middle Ages. The fort is situated at the bottom of Longis Hill.
